1	Anise Hyssop – Sun-Lt. shade,3-5’, attracts bees, edible flowers, flavoring, teas		
2	Basil – Devotion: Full sun, 18-20 “; An excellent aromatic sweet Genovese-type basil; MILDEW RESISTANT!!		
3	Basil – Greek Columnar: Sun, 24-36”, does not flower, slow-cooked dishes, pesto		
4	Basil – Thai: Full sun, 16-20”; 2” long leaves have a spicy, anise-clove flavor. Attractive purple stems and blooms.		
5	Borage – Sun, 2-3’; attracts bees, edible leaves, tiny blue flowers, flavoring, salads, self-seeds		
6	Chamomile: Sun, 1-2.5’, tea, potpourris, garnish, crafts		
7	Cilantro: Sun-pt. shade, 20-24”, stews and meat dishes		
8	Comfrey: Full sun, 3’ x2.5’; large clumping perennial primarily grown today as an ornamental; also medicinal purposes		
9	Dill (Teddy): Sun-pt. shade, 3-5’, teas, seasonings, vinegars, salads, fish		
10	Fennel – Bronze: Sun, up to 6’, edible licorice flavored leaves and seeds, soups, salads, etc.		
11	Fennel – Florence: Sun, 4-5’ entire plant edible, sausage, fish, soups, veggies		
12	Garlic – Society: Qt. pot, Full sun; flowers appear atop 1 foot tall, grass-like stems from early summer to autumn; edible		
13	Germander: Sun-pt. shade, 10-12”, shrubby perennial, attracts bees, plant for edging		
14	Lavender – Grosso: Sun, 1-2’, most fragrant, drought tolerant, baking, beverages		
15	Lavender – Hidcote: Sun, 16-18” mounding English variety that is easy to grow, likes well drained soil		
16	Lavender – Spanish: Sun, 2-3’, pineapple shaped purple bloom, sachets, potpourri		
17	Lemon Balm: Sun – pt. shade, 24-36”, salads, baked goods, medicinal uses such as ease stress and anxiety		
18	Lemon Grass – West Indian Qt. pot: Sun, 4-6’, tea, marinade, stir-fries, salads, pest repellent		
19	Lemon Verbena: Sun, 2-5’ flavoring for drinks, salads, teas, herb pillows		
20	Marjoram – compactum: Full sun to part. shade; 12X18“mound; dwarf form vegetables, tomato-based dishes, stuffing, etc.		
21	Mint – Mojito: Full sun to part shade; 2’X2’; mild and warm spearmint scent; Mint Juleps and Mojitos, etc.		
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22	Oregano – Greek Mountain: Sun to part shade; less than 6" tall. strong flavor similar to reg Greek oregano, nice in containers					
23	Oregano – Italian: Lt Full Sun to Partial Shade, 12-18", Strong aromatic and flavorful, dark green leaves, small white flowers					
24	Parsley – Curly: Sun, 1' biennial; salads, stews, sauces, soups					
25	Rosemary – Hill Hardy: Full sun, 4'H; Drought tolerant and hardy to zone 6, Aromatic herb for cooking, soaps, etc.					
26	Sage – Pineapple: Sun, 2-3', attracts hummingbirds, used in teas, jams, potpourri					
27	Sage – Purple: Sun, 3'X3'; flavorful sages and can be interchanged with regular garden sage; looks nice planted w/ Lavender					
28	Spinach – Red Malabar: Sun; Heat loving salad and stir-fry green. Vigorous climbing vines grow through summer into fall.					
29	Tarragon – French: 3'X3'; essential herb for French cuisine; Flavors similar to anise, licorice, and fennel					
30	Thyme – English: Sun, 1'x1' evergreen perennial; savory herb, flowers attract honey bees and other pollinators					
31	Thyme – Gold Lemon: Sun, 1'X1'; perennial kitchen herb with lavender-pink flowers in spring and lemon scented foliage.
